

PHOENIX DISTRICT 1ST ANNUAL FIRST AID MEET



WHEN: January 7, 2017 8:00 AM—Noon

WHERE: Cypress Creek Christian Church

COST: \$5.00/Person

The First Aid Meet is an event that challenges Scouts abilities to perform first aid in simulated real-life situations. Boy Scout patrols compete in practical first aid problems, displaying knowledge and hands-on skills from the Boy Scout Handbook, First Aid Merit Badge pamphlet and current American Red Cross guidelines. The top two winning Boy Scout patrols at each district's First Aid Meet are eligible to compete in the Council First Aid Meet.

Teams: Patrols must be from existing (natural) patrols. Venturers are not allowed to participate in the district meet. Each team should be composed of a minimum of three members, with a maximum of five members allowed to compete.

Judging: The judging standard will be the current Boy Scout Handbook and the First Aid Merit Badge pamphlet. Each patrol shall provide an adult to serve with the administration of the meet.

Awards: Awards will be given to the top three teams. The first and second place winners will represent the district at the Council First Aid Meet (no ties). Only those patrol members who participated in the district meet with their winning patrol can participate as patrol members at the Council meet. No substitutions to the patrols are allowed at the Council event.

Equipment: Each patrol should provide a troop/patrol size first aid kit; and patrol flag. Every participant needs to bring a copy of the [BSA Annual Health and Medical Record](#) (Parts A and B for all Scouting events).

Scenarios: For each scenario, there will be five Scouts allowed in the contest grid. All other patrol members must "sit out." A member of the patrol will serve as a victim in the scenario. No books, electronic devices, cards or pamphlets are allowed.
